## **Great Arrests by Central Station Officers**

I would like to conclude this week's newsletter by briefly sharing with you two great arrests. Both happened a week ago on Thursday, August 21<sup>st</sup>.

The first was around 2:00 p.m. **Plainclothes Sergeant McDevitt, Inspector Paulsen, Officers Murphy, Paulsen, Richins, Ciudad, Christensen, Huang and Morales** observed two auto burglars as they watched them break into a car at Pier 23. Both suspects were taken into custody and one of the suspects was wanted for a Homicide in the East Bay. Great work!

Later that evening, when the team booked the two Auto Burglary suspects, they were back on patrol. **Sergeant McDevitt and Officer Huang** observed two suspects, who were breaking into a residence in the area of Stockton and Francisco, were taken into custody and charged with Burglary! The San Francisco Police Department has developed a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is modeled after and works in partnership with the San Francisco Fire Department's Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT). The ALERT program will train members of the public to assist law enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrol of business and residential areas, and reporting criminal activity. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and live, work, or attend high school in San Francisco.

#### Three steps to becoming an ALERT volunteer:

1. Complete NERT training and receive certification. To register for NERT training courses please visit [www.sfgov.org/sfnert](http://www.sfgov.org/sfnert)
2. Once NERT certified, forward a copy of your NERT ID card to the ALERT program. [sfpdalert@sfgov.org](mailto:sfpdalert@sfgov.org)
3. After clearing a basic background check the individual is eligible to register for ALERT training.
