


What does the future of transportation look like to you?

EQUITY

All users of the transportation system have equitable and affordable access to desired goods, services, activities and destinations.



ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY

The transportation system supports a healthy environment and sustainable choices for future generations.



SAFETY AND LIVABILITY

People have attractive and safe travel options that support health, support livable neighborhoods, and address the needs of all users.



ECONOMIC VITALITY

People and businesses easily access key destinations for jobs and commerce, including established and growing neighborhoods both within San Francisco and the region.
